

# NOTES TO USERS

**This CD File contains specific instructions on how to make the various components of Sangha Robes used in the Mahayana Tibetan Gelug Tradition. The files are listed with the names of the particular components. There are two types of files. One file is in word and is a file that gives written instructions on the production of that component, like the Gnulen or undershirt. The second file with the same name (like Gnulen) is in a compressed format, which contains the Diagrams that illustrate the written instructions (For some reasons, when converted to pdf format, diagrams sometimes changed their order within a set [like Rabjung], so they may not be in the correct order). To accurately display the Diagrams, which are according to scale, one must simply resize the Diagram by copying the file to one's computer and then do an *Edit Picture* and resize. By clicking on the right side of the mouse, you can display the properties of any diagram. If it is not already set to the original size, you can reconstruct it to its original size by noting that information.**

**The original diagrams given here were constructed on an A4 sheet of graph paper. Therefore, if you print off these diagrams, which have been resized to that dimension, you can rely on the accuracy of the scale noted. Not all diagrams are to scale, only those so labeled. Diagrams to scale can be used to make patterns by simply following a ratio to enlarge. Also, specific information is given on how to enlarge patterns in the written instructions.**

**The Namjar is not presented as the author has not taken full ordination and, thus, is not qualified to have that information.**
